Celebrate Diocese of Fond du Lac

A celebration of the Diocese of Fond du Lac, its history and its people will be held on Saturday, July 27 at St. Paul's Cathedral. This will be a wonderful opportunity to celebrate our diocese, as we reunify into the Diocese of Wisconsin; and to celebrate 150 years of the Diocese of Fond du Lac.

So that as many folks who want to attend are able to, St. Augustine's is renting a coach bus to get us there and back. (This bus is equipped with a bathroom, but we will make at least one stop each way.) Please sign up in the guild hall if you are interested in traveling together.

Changes, changes, changes

People continue to ask what the reunification to the Diocese of Wisconsin means for us at St. Augustine's. It means we continue to carry out the ministries that we have always done in order to spread the word of Jesus and the will of God. We continue our mission of growing the love of Jesus in the community.

Many of the changes will be in diocesan structure and staffing. The changes in structure and staffing are intended to make more resources available to us in the form of people and resources as we continue our individual ministries and work together with other parishes to regionally spread the message of the kingdom.

Folks have wondered about the bishop's visitation schedule. Church canons indicate a bishop must visit a parish once every three years. When Bishop Matt was responsible only for the

Diocese of Fond du Lac he visited once a year. When he became provisional bishop for Eau

Claire, he visited every 18 months. Now that he will be bishop of the Diocese of Wisconsin it

means he will likely visit once every three years.

At this point, there will not be a central Diocese of Wisconsin office. The individual offices will

continue to operate for a while. After that, employees will most likely work from their homes.

All three cathedrals will continue to be home to parishes, and will host services of the

dioceses. Some of the more significant services, such as the Chrism Mass, may be held at more

than one location, to make attendance at these services easier.

Rather than deaneries, the diocese will be divided into five regions. Twice a year, the bishop

will spend a week in each region. At that time, he will visit churches, not just on Sundays, but

during the week when ministry is knowingly happening.
